# CAMP LOCATION AND VENUE

The camp will be held, from 8 to 15 August, in the province of Gauteng, South Africa. Gauteng, which means "place of gold", is one of the nine provinces of South Africa. Situated in the Highveld, Gauteng is the

smallest province in South Africa, accounting for only 1.5% of the land area.

Our chosen venue is Kopanong Hotel and Conference Centre. The venue is about 15km away from OR Tambo International Airport. Kopanong provides large conference rooms, sporting areas, free WiFi etc.

This year, YOTA South Africa will be introducing something new. Train-the-trainer is a brand new initiative that will focus on creating young ambassadors for amateur radio. All of the activities presented in South Africa will equip youngsters with the knowledge and skills to organize similar events on local, national or sub-regional level when they return back to their home countries. In achieving this objective, we will be able to spread YOTA activities including amateur radio on a broader level in society.



#### ACTIVITIES

Some of our main activities include:

- Train-the-trainer
- BACAR (Balloon Carrying Amateur Radio) launching and tracking of a high altitude balloon with various radio equipment on-board to explore near-space.
- Working Amateur Radio Satellites Workshop and Presentation
- Software Defined Radio
- Cultural event and African wildlife
- Building your own personal radio transceiver kit
- Intercultural evening
- Presentation by a local AM broadcast station
- HAREC Certificate lectures and examination
- Rapid Deployment Amateur Radio, its acronym RaDAR, come and find out more! And many more!

This year 28 teams will participate from all over IARU-Region 1. Participants will be split into 2 groups for the daily activities. During some activities youngsters will compete against one another. The winning team or participant will be awarded a prize on the final night.

#### RADIO STATION


The official YOTA SA callsign, ZS9YOTA, will be available for all participants to use. A fully equipped radio station will be available at all times.

- Passport and ID card

- A copy of your Radio Amateur license (If you have one)
- Cellphone and charger

- 2m Handheld Radio (If you have extra, please bring them as well. Remember to mark them with your callsign.)
- Swim suite and towel (Yes, it is winter, but this is Africa!)
- Hat/cap
- Sunscreen (MOST IMPORTANT SPF30 or more!)
- Comfortable clothing for the duration of the event
- Camera
- National flag (At least 1 per country)
- Toiletries
- A **warm** jacket and appropriate clothing for the early mornings and late afternoons Remember its winter in the Southern Hemisphere!
- QSL-cards to exchange with other participants
- Food/Drinks and traditional clothing for the intercultural evening



#### INTERCULTURAL EYENING

The YOTA Intercultural evening is a famous YOTA event where youngsters bring food and drinks from their countries to share with the other countries. Sweets, cold drinks and non-perishable foods are always a good idea.

As most of you will be traveling to South Africa via air travel, please keep in mind that some food products will not be allowed to be brought into the borders of the Republic of South Africa.
